



Registration Packets/Online Registration

- Registration packets will be available in Glasgow's front office on 3/9/2022.
- Students who are new to the district may register online. The online registration link has been posted on the Registration Information page of the Glasgow Middle School website.

Documents Needed For Registration: Sixth grade students entering from WITHIN the East Baton Rouge Parish School System

- Most recent report card
- Most recent test scores
- Copy of social security card
- Copy of birth certificate

- Latin I (1 high school credit)--Prerequisite: Successful completion of Latin A/B.
- French II (1 high school credit)--Prerequisite: Successful completion of French I.
- Spanish II (1 high school credit)--Prerequisite: Successful completion of Spanish I.
- Latin II (1 high school credit)--Prerequisite: Successful completion of Latin I.

Talented Courses--If your child has been identified as talented, please check all areas in which your child is talented.

- Talented Visual Art
- Talented Music
- Talented Theatre

Talented Courses--Students identified as talented will be enrolled in a talented class unless a parent completes a refusal of talented services form. Eighth grade students who are enrolled in a talented visual art or talented theatre class will be enrolled in a high school credit class. If your child will refuse talented services during the 2022-2023 school year, please list which talented services (art, music, or theatre) your child will refuse.

Your answer

If you are interested in having your child screened for talented services, please select the area of interest. Before making a selection, please review the requirements with your child. A parent/guardian must complete the screening permission form before their student will be screened. If you have any questions about the talented screening process, please contact Amy Rivet (arivet@ebrschools.org; 225-925-2942).

- Talented Visual Art--For the screening, the student must submit a portfolio of 3-5 pieces of artwork.
- Talented Music--For the screening, the student must perform two contrasting musical selections (one fast and one slow). Students should practice differentiating pitch, rhythm, and tone. Students in seventh and eighth grades should practice sight reading.
- Talented Theatre--For the screening, the student must perform a monologue from a list. If you would like for your child to be screened, Ms. Rivet will provide you with a copy of the monologue list.

Math Dual Enrollment--This option is mainly for seventh and eighth grade students. However, requests from parents of sixth grade students will be considered on a case-by-case basis. If you are interested in your child being dual enrolled in upper level math courses, please select the area of interest. This math class will replace one of the two elective classes. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA: (1) LEAP/LEAP 2025--The student must score advanced on their grade level math test on the most recent administration of the LEAP test. Additionally, students who took LEAP 2025 for either Algebra I or Geometry must also score advanced on the LEAP 2025 test. (2) GRADES--The student must have earned no more than one B in math during any nine weeks grading period of the 2021-2022 school year. Students who earned a C, D, or F in math for any nine weeks grading period of the 2021-2022 school year are not eligible to enroll in dual math. Math Placement Testing

All students who are considering enrolling in Glasgow's Gifted, Scholastic Academy, and Great Scholars Academy programs are encouraged to take the math placement test. Students enrolling in Glasgow's other academic programs are also welcome to take the math placement test.

Math Placement Testing

- Students will be placed in math classes based on district guidelines.

Math Placement Testing

- Students will have 120 minutes to complete the test.
- The test will cover state standards from sixth grade, seventh grade, and eighth grade math.
- If you would like more information about these standards, you may review K-12 Louisiana Student Standards for Math on the Louisiana Department of Education website.

Math Placement Testing

- Students should bring two sharpened pencils with good erasers.
- All other items necessary to complete the test (calculators, rulers, protractors, scratch paper, etc.) will be provided.

Summer Blitz

- As an initiative to increase student performance and orient incoming 6th grade students to middle school life, Glasgow Middle School will offer a summer blitz program.
- This program is designed to acquaint our new 6th graders with the daily procedures and expectations of a Glasgow Gator. Students in other grades who are new to Glasgow are also welcome to attend!

Summer Blitz

- Activities have been designed to concentrate on English Language Arts and Mathematics as well as our PBIS (positive behavioral interventions and supports) program and campus layout.
- There are 100 spots available, and entry to the program is on a first come, first served basis.

Summer Blitz

- The Blitz Program will run from June 6th - June 23th (Monday through Thursday) and will last from 8 A.M.- 12 P.M. each day.
- This program is free of charge.
- Breakfast and lunch will be served daily.

Summer Blitz

- Students will need to purchase a Glasgow Middle Summer Blitz t-shirt for \$10.00. This shirt may also be worn as a uniform shirt during the school year.
- Over the course of the program, students will also attend a field trip. Parents are responsible for payment of field trip costs if applicable.

Summer Blitz

After care will be provided from 12 P.M. – 4 P.M. each day.

- The cost for this service is \$100 per week.
- Parents who enroll in after care prior to May 15, 2022 will receive a 50% discount.

Summer Blitz

- A Summer Blitz registration form will be included in the registration packet.
- Parents may also register by completing a Google Form. The form has been posted on the Registration Information page of the Glasgow Middle School website.

Aftercare

- Until 4:30 PM
- Registration Fee: \$50 (one time fee for 2022-2023 school year)
- Rate: \$50 per week
- Multiple sibling discounts are available.

Dress Code

- Navy blue 3 button collared shirt with NO logo
- Medium khaki or navy pants, shorts, skirts (NO jeans, jumpers, biking shorts, tight fitting/stretch/skinny pants, sweat pants, wind suits, large pocket/cargo pants, flare pants, overalls, cutoffs, or camouflage)

Dress Code

- Students may wear SOLID navy blue or black jackets and sweatshirts. Glasgow outerwear purchased on campus is also acceptable.
